

## **INSTRUCTIONS FOR JEEP WRANGLER JK**

## HOOD LATCH

## Time To Install: Approx. 45 minutes

Tool Needed: 10mm socket, 13mm socket, ratchet, phillips head screw driver, and cutoff wheel




**1.** Begin by opening the hood and locating the two nuts that mount the locking block. Remove them using a 10mm socket.




**2.** Next, by sliding a 13mm socket and ratchet through the opening as shown, remove the single nut that mounts the base block (See Photo 2A & 2B).

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
4. Insert the stainless tab into the billet base block (See Photo 4A) Make sure that it is facing upward. Then place the screw from the factory base block over the stainless tab in the billet base block (See Photo 4B). You can now place the factory rubber stop onto the stainless tab (See Photo 4C).







**5.** Place the factory rubber strap into the billet base block and align with the barrel nut (See Photo 5A). Insert one of the supplied screws through the other side of the base block and make snug (See Photo 5B).

**t6.** Place the factory rubber strap into the billet latch and align with the barrel nut (See Photo 6A). Insert one of the supplied screws through the other side of the latch and make snug. You can now tighten both the base block and latch using a phillips head screw driver (See Photo 6B).







**9.** Place the billet locking block back into the factory position (See Photo 9A), and tighten using the factory nuts and a 10mm socket and ratchet (See Photo 9B). Repeat for the other side, close the hood and you're finished! (See Photo 9C)

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
