


BRUTE DOUBLE CAB TONNEAU COVER

BRACKET INSTALLATION

I. REMOVE TAIL LIGHTS

- 1. Remove two (2) Phillips head screws from inner-side of tail light (fig. 1).
- 2. Carefully remove tail light from bed and unplug the wiring connector.



II. REMOVE REAR INNER FENDERS

1. Carefully pry the two (2) fasteners holding inner fenders to bed (fig. 2).




- 2. Drill out the plastic rivets holding inner fenders to fender flares (fig. 3).
- 3. Carefully remove inner fenders.



III. MARK LOCATION FOR TONNEAU COVER BRACKETS

- 1. Position brackets as shown (fig. 4) measuring 1/2" from top of bed.
- 2. Mark holes using a marker or grease pencil.
- 3. When all four bracket locations are marked, drill 5/16" holes being careful not to drill through to the other side of the bed. It is recommended to use a drill stop set to 1/2".



IV. ATTACH BRACKETS

- 1. Work through the tail light openings to attach rear brackets with provided hardware (fig. 5).
- 2. With help, locate the backing plates for the front brackets by reaching up from the fender well inside of the bed. Attach with provided hardware.
- 3. Once attached, torque all hardware to 7 ft/lbs. BE CAREFUL NOT TO OVER-TORQUE.
- 4. Re-install tail lights.
- 5. Re-install inner fenders. Use the provided plastic rivets and a plastic rivet gun to re-fasten inner fenders to fender flares.




V. ATTACH TONNEAU COVER

- 1. Place tonneau cover assembly over cab end of truck bed (fig. 6).
- 2. With the tailgate open, completely unfold the tonneau cover (fig. 7).
- 3. Slide rear clamps out to the bed wall. Pull down clamp and hook under brackets (fig. 8).








IMPORTANT NOTICE

While driving, tonneau must be completely flat and secure with all four clamps in the closed position or completely folded up (all panels) and secured at the cab. DO NOT DRIVE with tonneau in partially opened position.

Note: Tarp cannot be removed from aluminum frame. Attempting to do so will cause damage and void the warranty.
