## Fender Flare installation instructions

## Line up Flares to stock flare holes

• The fender flares do not require the body to be cut unless there are obstructions. Shave the metal should not be necessary to make a good fit. Stock flare holes are used for mounting and no drilling is required. Flare mounting area on each side should line up with stock flare holes to provide a symmetrical fit. It might be necessary to shave or remove some or all of the stock body molding or badges. A hair dryer pointed at molding or badges will cause them to lift right off if they're installed using adhesive. Be careful not to blister the paint with too much heat.

## Drilling Mounting Holes is not required Mounting the Flares

- Once any obstructions such as molding or badges are removed, it's time to mount the flares.
  Mounting them is pretty straightforward, but because the screws are self-tapping they may
  require some effort to drive in. The screws may require some effort to drive in. It's not
  recommended to drive them with a drill because of the chance of over-tightening and
  stripping them or obliterating the head of the screw. Turn them in by hand until they're tight,
  without cracking the flares.
- · Fastening hardware comes with Kit for each stock flare hole:
  - o 1 self-tapping Screw
  - o 2 Washers
  - 1 Spacers inside of fender securing fender flare using self-tapping screw with washers
