This Complete Soft Top Kit is designed to fit on your 2 Door JK Wrangler when the hard top or original soft top has been completely removed. Before beginning your installation of this product, carefully remove your hard top or current soft top hardware. During the installation of this product you will encounter several steps that will require two people to properly install the hardware.

Before you begin Installation:

We are excited that you have chosen the MasterTop Complete Soft top Hardware System. This high quality bow and door surround system is designed to provide a platform for the installation of a fabric soft top. Please note that it is important that you become familiar with the installation process of this top by reading the following instruction sheet and warnings thoroughly.

When unpacking, carefully check to make sure all parts are included. If any part is missing or broken, please call MasterTop customer service at 720-575-5440.

Soft Top Hardware Installation











Step 1: Install Bow Mount Brackets to Roll Bar

Put your safety glasses.

Locate the (2) bow mounting brackets and (4) Torx head pivot bracket bolts shown in FIG 1. Carefully unzip the roll bar padding on the vertical side tube to expose the two factory holes in the roll bar (FIG 2).

Place the bow mounting brackets over the factory holes making sure the bracket is right side up as shown in FIG 3 and using the T-30 Torx head pivot bracket bolts, install brackets to the roll bar (FIG4).

Slip the roll bar padding back over the installed brackets carefully slipping the bracket mounts through the slits in the roll bar padding (FIG 5). Repeat on passenger side.






Step 2: Door Surrounds Assembly

Locate the driver's side rear over door assembly and the driver's side pillar assembly shown in FIG 6.

In the driver's side rear over door assembly, there is a screw, installed for shipping (Fig 7). Remove this screw and set aside. Line up the Driver's side Rear over door assembly and the driver's side pillar assembly as shown in Fig 8 & 9 making sure the holes line up. Insert the screw over the top of the hole as shown in Fig 10. Tighten this screw using the enclosed 4mm allen head tool securing the two pieces (Fig 11 & 12).

Repeat this procedure on the other side.





Step 3: Install Door Surrounds to Jeep

Locate the assembled Driver's side rear door surround On the bottom of the vertical pillar portion of the assembled door surround is a pin that will be inserted into the body tub as shown in FIG 13. Insert the door surround pin into the body tub. After inserting the pin, locate the upper portion of the door surround "C" attachment and push onto roll bar (FIG's 14 & 15).


Make sure the front seal is snug against the windshield seal as shown in FIG 16. The "C" should fit in the cutout of the roll bar pad. Line up the threads in the "C" with the top hole in the roll bar.

Step 3: Install Door Surrounds to Jeep continued

Locate the two sets of screw knobs. Line up the door surround "C" attachment holes with the vertical holes in the roll bar. Slip the front knob through the hole in the front door surround (FIG 17). Tighten the knob securing the front door surround (FIG 18). Repeat this procedure on the back of the door surround and on the other side of the vehicle. Finally, tighten all four knobs. All knobs on both sides of the vehicle should be secured to the roll bar.

Step 4: Attach Center/Rear Bow Assembly to side Bows

Locate the center/rear bow assembly and the over door bows. (Fig 19 & 20).

You will be attaching the over door bows to the center/rear bow assembly where circle in red. On the driver's side bow you will find a screw and nut installed for shipping (Fig. 21). Remove this screw and nut and set aside. Line up the driver's side over door bow (with the quick release knob facing inwards) to the center bow leg (fig. 22). Insert the screw and nut, tighten using a Phillips head screw driver and a socket wrench 10mm as shown in FIG 23. Repeat on Passenger side.





Step 5: Install Complete Bow assembly to the Vehicle

Locate the complete bow assembly from step 4. With a friend, carefully place the bow assembly over the roll bar and line up the assembly to the lower bow mount bracket (Fig's 24 & 25) with the quick release knob facing inwards.

Line up the Quick release knuckle with the lower bow mount bracket attachment and attach each side of the center bow assembly to the bracket (Figs 26, 27, 28 & 29). Repeat on other side of vehicle.












FIG 31 Upper Bow Mount




Step 6: Install Rear Bow Legs to Bow Mounts and Rear Bow

Locate the two rear bow legs as called out in FIG 30. These bow legs will be installed on the top bow mount located on the roll bar (FIG 31). Place the rear bow leg with the quick Release knob facing out and the loop portion facing down (FIG 32) while pulling the quick release knob out, connect the rear bow leg to the bow mount bracket (FIG's 33 & 34). Repeat on other side of vehicle.

At this point both the center bow and the rear bow mount legs should be installed on the bow mount bracket on the roll bar as shown in FIG 35. The Center bow should be on the lower bracket and the rear bow should be on the upper bracket mount.






With the two Rear Bow Legs installed to the Bow mount Bracket, locate the rear bow called out in FIG 35. On the Bow leg there is a set screw that needs to be removed. You will use this screw to mount the Bow Legs to the Rear Bow. With the help of a friend, lift the rear bow from resting on the roll bar legs and slide it into the rear bow leg (FIG 36). Once both sides are secure, use the set screw to mount the rear bow leg and rear bow (FIG's 37 & 38).





























Step 7: Install Over Door Bows to Front Header Assembly

Locate the Fabric/Header as shown in FIG 39. With the help pf a friend, lift the assembly over the vehicle.

Insert the "knuckle" installed on the Header Assembly into the Over door Bow (FIG 40). Secure the bows into the door surround clip placing the round hole into the door surround clip (FIG 41 & 42). In the driver's side bows assembly, there is a screw, installed for shipping. Unscrew it a bit using a Phillips head screw driver to place this bow and tighten to the Door Surround as shown in fig 43.

Slide the bow sleeve over the knuckles as shown in FIG 44 & 45. Repeat this procedure on the opposite side.





STEP 8: Drape Top

Drape the top fabric over the cab. The front header should be resting on the windshield but not attached/clamped and the top fabric should be laid back but not attached to the rear bows.

STEP 9: Securing the Cable Spring

Locate the Cable spring hanging out of the top behind the rear seat, next to the rear vertical door surrounds. Fold back the front header to reduce the side cable tension. With the front header tension release, attach the spring to the bracket and (see call out on figs 49 & 50)

The bracket is encased in a Fabric "tube". As shown in Fig 50a, slip the cable spring through the "tube" and attach it to the top bracket and press the 2 buttons to secure the spring, so it cannot be easily slipped off.





STEP 10: Install the Center bow flap

Flip the rear of the top forward exposing the center Bow. Install the velcro flap that attach the center bow. (Bow#1 over the soundbar).See Fig 51





STEP 11: Install Rear Corner

With the front bows attached to the top, pull down on the rear bow while securing the rear corners into the retainers on the vehicle. (See Fig's 52 & 53).

NOTICE

READ BEFORE PROCEEDING TO STEP 12: On some Tops the rear bow flap is one piece. The pictures in Fig 54 & 55 below shows the rear bow flap as "tabs". For Step 12 below, If the Soft top is too tight and the corners are loose, or if the top is too loose and the corners too tight you may need to un-screw the screws in Step 12 and re-screw them to the flap to adjust the top and corner attachments. Also, if there are small "puckers" that form on the rear seam after the front header is secured, we suggest unscrewing and reinstalling the rear bow screws after step 19 with the rear window installed.





STEP 12: Install Rear Bow Screws

With the front header unattached, pull on the fabric towards the rear of the vehicle providing tension on the front header (Header should be pulled up about 20-30 degrees) and re-install the 4 screws through the rear bow fabric to Bow #2 using the screws you previously removed from your original top. Note that there will not be holes in the rear bow fabric/Tabs. You will need to punch the screws through the fabric keeping the top tight while installing. On some models the straps may have to wrap around the opposite side of the bow. Regardless, the bow straps should be tight. See FIGs 54 & 55.





STEP 13: Secure Front of Top to Windshield

With the cable spring installed, with two people (one on each side of the header) fold down the header to the windshield and close the front header latches to secure the front of the top to the windshield. See FIGs 56,57&58.





ACAUTION A

The leading edge of the soft top must be secured to prevent the loss of the top at speed. Latches must be fully closed and free of mud and another contamination. Do not use top if either latch is damaged.









STEP 14: Attach Quarter Window Zippers

Attach the quarter window zipper by starting the zipper on the quarter window and zipping it closed 2-3- inches.

Repeat this on the other side of the vehicle. See figs $59\ \&\ 60$

Step 15: Attach Front of Quarter Windows

Attach the front of the quarter windows along the front edge of the vertical door surround by rolling the plastic into the slot on the door surround.

Repeat this on the other side of the vehicle. See figs 61 & 62.






Step 16: Attach Bottom of Quarter Windows

Roll the bottom of the quarter window into the retainer channel on the vehicle and then close the quarter window zipper the rest of the way.

Close up the hook and loop fasteners around the zippers.









Step 17: Attach Elastic Window Straps

Snap the elastic window roll straps on the rear bow above the rear window opening.

These straps can be used to secure your rear window when rolled up.

See Figs 66 & 67.





Step 18: Attaching the Tailgate Bar Brackets

Locate the Tailgate bar and brackets (FIG 68). Locate the driver's side bracket (marked on the bracket) with the lip to the outside of the vehicle, line up the bracket with the slot in the body tub, hook the rear portion of the bracket to the body tub and roll the bracket forward until it clicks.

See FIGs 69, 70, 71. Repeat this procedure on the pas- senger side. See the Soft top or Soft accessory instruction sheet for the proper installation of the tailgate bar into these brackets.







NOTICE

Before rolling up the rear window, make sure the glass is clean. Dirt and Debris can cause scratches when rolled up.











Step 19: Prepare Rear Window for Installation

Locate the rear window and place it on a soft surface with the backing side up.

Take the factory bar removed in step one and orient the "C" Channel with the round seal facing down and slide the "C" Channel onto the rear window retainer as shown in Figs 72 & 73.

After sliding the retainer all the way through the "C" Channel, roll the tailgate bar into the mounts with the outside of the fabric facing towards the rear of the vehicle. See Figs 74 & 75.











STEP 20: Secure Rear Curtain

Secure the rear window zipper by pulling the two zipper sliders all the way down as far as possible in order to catch the sliders on the zipper pin. Once the zipper is caught, raise the zipper 1" -2".

Hold the top of the window with one hand and zip up the zipper all the way with the other hand. Make sure that the tailgate bar is centered. If the zippers have too much distance between the windows and the top, slide the rear corners around towards the middle of the vehicle until the zipper can be closed. See Figs 76 & 77.

Truck the flaps under the window zippers into the retainers to secure the rear window. See figs 78 & 79.

Top Installation is now complete!

Fold Back Feature Use:

Your Soft top hardware has both a front fold back feature, and the ability to be folded all the way back to the rear of the vehicle.

Folding Back the Front Section #1

Unlatch the two front Windshield latches (fig98). Slide the over door sleeves forward to unlock the front hinge (Fig 99 & 100). This will allow you to fold the top back into the sunroof position. With the help of a friend, lift up the Front header and fold it back (fig 101).

<u>Note:</u> When top is closed, slide sleeves rearward over the hinge to lock the bow in place.





Folding Back the Front Section #2

For the next position you will need to tuck/ fold the fabric under the header, which opens up the "sunroof" completely as shown in fig.102 & 103.

Folding Back the Rear Section

To fold back your rear bows, remove the rear and quarter windows from your soft top (Fig.104 & 105). Uninstall the rear corner fabric (fig.106). Unlatch the door surround clip (both sides) as shown in Fig 107 & 107a.









Once the over door bows are (Fig. 108), with the help of a friend take the header assembly and pull all the way back Fig 109, resting the header on the rear of the vehicle as shown in fig 110.
